

The Bounty Ships Scheme to Australia

British King

The *British King* (William Paton, Master; Alexander Arbuckle, Surgeon) sailed from Tobermory on 28th October and arrived in Sydney on 28th February 1839. It embarked 252 adult and 74 child passengers.
